

RECORDKEEPING AND REPORTING

It's that time of year when your OSHA injury and illness logs (Form 300) are reviewed, and the information documented on the summary (Form 300A). Ensure you have an incident report for each log entry and enough follow-up information to complete the log accurately. Check your industry code, your average number of employees, and your total hours worked for accuracy. Hint: your total number of hours worked should be about 2,000 x the number of employees.

Remember that all fatalities need to be reported to OSHA within 8 hours and all amputations, hospitalizations, and loss of eye need to be reported within 24 hours. This is true for ALL employers. These reports can be made at osha.gov, by calling 1-800-321-OSHA, or in person or by phone at the nearest OSHA Area Office.
